**Adverbs Modifying
Adjectives & Adverbs**

- How to identify **Adverbs** that modify *adjectives* and other *adverbs*.
- How these **Adverbs** are used in a sentence.

Why It's Important:

- To further your understanding of **Grammar** and **Sentence Structure**.
- So you will know how to distinguish **Adverbs** and the words they modify.

Adverbs:

An **Adverb** modifies, or describes, a verb, an adjective, or another adverb .

An **Adverb** tells *how*, *when*, or *where* about the word it modifies.

An **Adverb** that modifies an *adjective* or another *adverb* almost always appears in front of the word it modifies.

For Example:

Cai is an **unusually** good skater. (the **Adverb** *unusually* tells *how* about the adjective *good*)

Marta **almost** always sings. (the **Adverb** *almost* tells *when* about the adverb *always*)

Adverbs often used to modify Adjectives and other Adverbs
